




Median Home Price Per Square Foot





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




Residential Water Rates for 10,000 Gallons








Commercial Water Rates for 50,000 Gallons















ECONOMIC COMMENTARY



- "Supply chain disruptions are still a problem for many businesses. Half of manufacturers and a third of service firms have reported problems that forced them to reduce output, per a recent New York Federal Reserve survey... The persistence of supply chain issues could make inflation stickier: 40% of manufacturers and a quarter of service firms have raised prices as a result."

- "Progress on inflation keeps hopes of a July interest rate cut on life support. But the Federal Reserve will be looking for more. Inflation edged down to 3.4% in April...3.6% excluding food and energy... Flat retail sales in April may indicate a modest slowing of consumer demand, alleviating price pressures. The average cost of goods fell for the second straight month."



DFW INFLATION





- Inflation for the 12 months ending in May 2024 was 5.0%.
- Not including food and energy costs, the March 2024 rate was 5.0%.

Property Tax Landscape (SB2)



- No New Revenue Rate
 - The rate that would collect the same amount of revenue as the prior year
- Voter Approval Tax Rate
 - SB2 voter approval rate limits growth to 3.5%
 - Limits growth in value of properties on the tax roll but not new construction
 - Scenario: 3.5% on existing properties, plus 2% from new property, results in total growth of 5.5%, permissible under the 3.5% voter approval cap
 - Automatic election if voter-approval tax rate is exceeded

 Generally speaking, a 3.5% increase in property tax revenue in FY 2025 would equal \$5.1M in additional revenue •••••





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

Current Maintenance Strategy


- The previous maintenance strategy was focused on red streets, "worst-first".








ON-DEMAND RIDERSHIP SINCE CITY-WIDE SERVICE


